
These are optional vocabulary cards to show your child before reading the story to help with understanding. It is also a great idea to point out the words while reading the book!

































<u>Art Project:</u> Outlining my Body

What you need for this activity:

*Sidewalk chalk

Directions:

*For this activity your child will draw themselves!

*To start ask you child(ren) to lay down on the pavement, face-up. Then trace them using the chalk.

**Depending on the age of your child(ren), they may be able to trace each other which is a great fine motor activity as well!

*Once their "outline" is complete, have them color themselves in, adding whatever body parts they know!

What you need for this activity:

Directions:



*When they are done write their name in dashed writing so that they may trace it.



<u>Math Activity:</u> <u>Sorting bodies</u>

What you need for this activity:

*Group of children (or family members)

OR Dolls/ stuffed animals

Directions:

*This activity will ask your child to practice their ability to sort things a great beginning step in learning to classify things!

*To start, gather the group of people or dolls/stuffed animals.

*Ask your children if they have any ideas about how they could sort these.

*If you are using people some ways would be: adult/child, long hair/short hair, color of hair etc.

*If you are using dolls/stuffed animals some ways would be: human/animal, soft/hard, fur/hair etc.

*Let your child be creative and have them explain how they are sorting to you!



Language Activity: Picture Introductions

What you need for this activity:

*Photograph (one you are okay being glued to paper)

*Blank piece of paper

*Non-toxic glue

*Writing Utensil

Directions:

*For this activity, your child will utilize their ability to describe utilizing oral language. This activity also encourages dictation which is an important step in the pre-writing process.

*With your child, choose a photograph that they like showing them moving it some way. For example: swimming, dancing, playing a sport, laughing etc.

*Have your child glue this image to the paper. Then ask them to describe to you what they are doing. We encourage you to write as they speak so that they can watch how words are formed.

*If they are doing this in a group setting, have them finish the activity by saying "My name is (name)" and then describe their picture.



<u>Science Activity:</u> <u>My Teeth</u>

What you need for this activity:

*Mirror

*Clean hands

*Animal images (optional)

Directions:

*For this science activity your child(ren) will learn about their teeth!

*To start – make sure each child participating in this science activity washes their hands well as they will be sticking their fingers into their mouths!

*Then, ask them to open their mouths REALLY wide and look inside using the mirror. Have them observe their teeth, what do they feel like, what do they look like? Are they sharp, or flat or, both?

*After they are done looking at their teeth, tell them they should feel two main types: flat and pointy. This is because they are *omnivores*. Which means they can eat meat and plants.

Sharp Teeth: for meat

Flat teeth: for plants

Animals who have only flat teeth are herbivores. Animals who have sharp teeth are carnivores.


