





































Art Project: Outlining my Body

What you need for this activity:

*Sidewalk chalk

- *For this activity your child will draw themselves!
- *To start ask you child(ren) to lay down on the pavement, face-up. Then trace them using the chalk.
- **Depending on the age of your child(ren), they may be able to trace each other which is a great fine motor activity as well!
- *Once their "outline" is complete, have them color themselves in, adding whatever body parts they know!

Pre-Writing Activity: <u>Horizontal lines</u>

What you need for this activity:

- *Tape (we recommend painter's tape)
- *Small items of choice

- *This activity will allow your child to work on their understanding of horizontal lines, an important line to understanding when learning to form letters!
- *To begin, ensure that your child understands what a horizontal line is if they do not show them some examples. Perhaps you have a piece of clothing with horizontal lines or pillow etc.
- *Then, ask them to form a horizontal line on the ground using the tape, encourage them to make it as straight as possible. (If you do not wish to use tape, they may form a horizontal line with sidewalk chalk on the pavement).
- *Following this, ask them to walk on the line, then lay on the line, finally have them cover the line with the small items.
- *To push this activity further, have them walk around (wherever you are) and find horizontal lines.

Math Activity:

Our hands can make patterns!

What you need for this activity:

- *Hand patterns page
- *Child-safe scissors
- *Non-toxic glue
- *Multiple children (or child and adult)


- *This activity will ask your child to work with their pattern abilities. As this activity is for the beginning of the (school) year, we will only focus on abab patterns to start. If you feel your child is ready, you may, of course, ask them to create more challenging patterns.
- *Have your child complete the pattern hands page.
- *Then create patterns with the hands of the people who are present. For example: mom's hand, child's hand, mom's hand, child's hand. **This is where you could push your child further perhaps: child's hand, child 2's hand, dad's hand, child 2's hand, dad's hand.



Language Activity: <u>I am special</u>

What you need for this activity:

- *Blank piece of paper
- *Coloring utensils

- *For this activity, your child will utilize their ability to describe utilizing oral language. This activity also encourages dictation which is an important step in the pre-writing process.
- * To begin, have your child draw a picture of themselves, as detailed as they are able to make it. While they are drawing encourage them to think about what makes them special: are they funny? do they like to dance? Are they a good friend?
- -Try to include this attribute in the picture.
- **Then have them describe to you what they drew. If they are able to have them write the words "I AM SPECIAL." They can either form the letters on their own or trace (after the adult makes dashed lines aka, I AM SPECIAL. Then have them dictate to you what makes them special!
- *If done in a group setting, the child can then share with the others.

Science Activity: My Teeth

What you need for this activity:

- *Mirror
- *Clean hands
- *Animal images (optional)

Directions:

- *For this science activity your child(ren) will learn about their teeth!
- *To start make sure each child participating in this science activity washes their hands well as they will be sticking their fingers into their mouths!
- *Then, ask them to open their mouths REALLY wide and look inside using the mirror. Have them observe their teeth, what do they feel like, what do they look like? Are they sharp, or flat or, both?
- *After they are done looking at their teeth, tell them they should feel two main types: flat and pointy. This is because they are *omnivores*. Which means they can eat meat and plants.

Sharp Teeth: for meat

Flat teeth: for plants

Animals who have only flat teeth are herbivores. Animals who have sharp teeth are carnivores.


